Level 1	• For low- level behaviour that affects the teaching and learning process in the classroom. The level 1 will generally be for repeated breaches of classroom rules but may be for a single incident if the class teacher deems it to be necessary. This may include failure to do homework, being out of their seat, being off task, distracting other students, arriving late to class, eating/drinking in class, treating school property/others' property disrespectfully, calling out, low level insolence.
