I look forward to working very hard with our school community so that we can continue to ensure that our students receive an education of the highest quality. Students are my focus! I look forward to meeting and working with you all.



Open Boys Hockey

After ambushing six teams in the NSW CHS Boys Hockey Knockout, the Moss Vale High School Boys had gained a position that no other boys hockey team had achieved in the school's history. That is, a place in the top 8 schools in NSW. To determine which public high school was the champion hockey playing school in the State, the boys travelled to Newcastle to face some very determined, talented and well drilled sides.



The luck of the draw would see the boys playing one of the best hockey areas in NSW first up. Bathurst was one of the favourites to take the overall honours although reputations didn't count for much as Moss Vale really took it up to the Bathurst Boys in the opening stanza. The first 20 minutes were very tight with both sides having opportunities although as the game progressed, the Moss Vale boys seemed to be getting the upper hand. This constant pressure was rewarded when Moss Vale High School went 1-0 up into the half time interval.



After the break, Moss Vale continued to fire although Bathurst was slowly getting back into the game. Some strong individual play allowed Bathurst to equalise with a goal giving them the impetus to knock in a further two goals. Unfortunately, we had come up against one of the stronger teams in the competition first up which knocked Moss Vale out into the second half of the draw. The form of both sides was strong with Bathurst proving their

credentials by defeating another team to advance to the Grand Final to play Oxley High (Tamworth).



Moss Vale's next opponent would be Kirawee HS. The Kirawee team could not match the class of the Moss Vale High side and were defeated 7-2. This put Moss Vale in a play-off for 5th and 6th with Grafton HS. Grafton had also drawn a strong early team in Oxley and had been knocked into the latter half of the draw. They, like Bathurst, are a hotspot for accomplished hockey players. They had placed third in NSW in 2011 and expected to beat the Moss Vale boys in a canter. Grafton had some ingenious and savvy players although they never clicked as a team. This had always been the strength of the Mossy boys.



Once again, both sides had opportunities that went begging although the tug of war that was developing meant that the game was turning into quite a spectacle with the

crowd voicing their support and getting into the game. The floodgates opened in the second half for Moss Vale when two quick goals were blasted past the Grafton keeper. Instead of coming together, the Grafton team disintegrated allowing Moss Vale to get another goal to claim a well deserved victory. This triumph gave Moss Vale the ranking of the 5th best hockey school in NSW, an incredible performance from a smaller High School. All the boys should be immensely proud of their achievements. Their attitude on and off the sporting field has been exemplary. Congratulation, legends!

Thank you and we look forward to dealing with you again in the future.







Information for school communities about measles

Sydney is currently experiencing an outbreak of measles which began in April 2012 and is centred in the South Western Sydney and Western Sydney regions. Many of the cases have been high school students, with a smaller number in primary school. There is potential for the measles outbreak to spread further given young people have large social networks both within and outside of school.

NSW Health advises that measles is a serious viral illness that mainly affects unvaccinated children, teenagers, young adults, and babies too young to be vaccinated. Measles is highly infectious and can easily spread through the air.

Immunisation is effective in preventing the disease. In Australia, infants and young children are vaccinated with measles-mumps-rubella vaccine at 12 months and 4 years of age. People who are at risk of measles include:

- Infants <12 months who are too young to have been routinely vaccinated
- Older children who have not received 2 doses of measles-containing vaccine
- Adults born during or after 1966 who have not received 2 doses of measlescontaining vaccine and haven't had measles infection in the past.

Immunising older siblings and non-immune adults will help prevent the spread of infection to infants who are too young to be vaccinated and who are at risk of severe disease.

The first sign of measles is a high fever which usually begins about 10 to 12 days after exposure to a person with measles (range 7-18 days). A runny nose, cough, red and watery eyes (conjunctivitis), and small white spots inside the cheeks can develop in the initial stage. The rash appears around 14 days after exposure, usually starting on the face and upper neck and spreading over the body, hands and feet. The rash lasts for 4-7 days.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

People with measles are usually infectious from just before the symptoms begin until four days after the rash appears. If you have had contact with someone who has had measles and develop <u>a fever, runny nose, cough, red and watery eyes</u>, it may be measles and seek medical advice.

If you suspect measles, see your doctor, clinic or hospital. It is important to <u>ring</u> <u>before your consultation</u> so you can be seen as soon as possible and arrangements can be made to avoid contact with other patients in the waiting room who may be susceptible to measles.

A person with measles should remain at home until four days after the rash appears to reduce the possibility of spreading it to other people.



My artwork represents the facades or masks that people put up to hide their inner truth. As you read the images, the mask or façade slowly wears off.


The smudging represents who the person really is. The words in the artwork are synonyms for 'mask' and 'façade'. The two lines of photographs are read like different chapters in a book.







I am attempting to show my audience my views on how different emotions expose different sides of us. I am challenging my audience to question themselves.



CHS State Athletics Carnival




Girls relay team
