# HIGHLANDS Drive Safe

## SAFER DRIVER COURSE – SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS

Red Car Driver Training has been accredited by the RMS to provide the Safer Drivers Course. Red Car Driver Training is working in collaboration with Highlands Drivesafe to deliver the course in Moss Vale.

The Safer Drivers Course is a combined theoretical and practical Course is for under 25 year old learner drivers who have completed 50 actual log book driving hours (not the 3-4-1 which is obtained through lessons with a driving instructor). It must be noted that this Course is NOT a conventional driving lesson, which is focussed on road rules and mechanics of driving, which is why they do require a base-level of driving experience and competent driving control skill to benefit the in-vehicle coaching that is part of the Course (students wishing to do the in-car session in a manual vehicle MUST be competent with clutch control and gear changes).

The Course comprises of two modules:

**Module one:** Is a three hour facilitated group discussion on how to manage risks on the road. This involves a maximum of twelve participants and is delivered by a facilitator. These sessions are held in one of the meeting rooms at the Moss Vale Services Club on a Sunday morning.

**Module two:** Is a two hour in vehicle coaching session to develop low-risk driving strategies. This involves two participants and a coach, and are held in vehicles (manual and auto) supplied by Highlands Drivesafe (with dual controls fitted).

The Safer Driver Course aims to provide learner drivers with driving strategies such as speed management, gap selection, hazard awareness and safe following distances so students are more prepared when they drive unsupervised on their provisional licences. The course also aims to help learners identify situations that will put them at greater risk of a crash and consider strategies that will help avoid them.

On completion of both modules of the course (both modules must be completed within 4 weeks), a learner driver will receive a 20 hour credit in their learner driver log book.

**The cost of the Course is \$140 including GST and must be paid in full prior to the start of the course.**






I am writing on behalf of the Berrima Division of Sydney Legacy, to thank you and the students of Moss Vale High School for your support during Legacy Week.



### What is QuickWeb?

- ▶ Secure online payment facility hosted by Westpac
- ▶ Accessed from the home page of the school's website
- ▶ \$Make a payment "button"

### Timing

- ▶ The payment must be made before 6pm for the school to receive the funds the next day. i.e. pay before 6pm on Monday, the school will have the funds on Tuesday morning.
- ▶ If the payment is after 6pm then there will be a delay of a day in the school receiving the funds i.e. pay after 6pm on Monday, the school will have the funds on Wednesday morning.
