National Assessment Program –Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

The 2016 NAPLAN results have been received for Years 7 and 9, and key staff members are in the process of analysing these results in detail. However, already I am extremely proud of the fact that our Year 9 results in the Reading component of the test show significant growth. Our entire Year 9 cohort for Reading was at state average and was significantly above similar school groups. We were well below state average in Reading at the 2012 NAPLAN and there has been an upward trend that has now seen us reach state average, and our Year 9 boys are above state average. There was a 3% increase in the students achieving in the top band (band 10) and a 5% increase in students achieving in the second top band (band 9). This was 3% higher than the state average achieving in this band.

These results are a strong indication that our focus on literacy strategies and the Kick off with Reading initiative have been highly successful at Moss Vale High School.

I am proud and pleased to announce that **Luke Webb** of Year 11, one of our new School Captains, has been awarded the 2016 John Lincoln Youth Community Service Award. This award recognises **Luke's** '*outstanding community service for the benefit of others and for demonstrating a spirit of goodwill'*. Luke will be presented with his award at the Week 9 assembly.

Acting Deputy Principal's Report

Bullying and Harassment ?

Bullying is an issue in all schools, however it does not need to be. At Moss Vale High School we genuinely pride ourselves on dealing with such issues in the vast majority of circumstances with a successful outcome.

However there are statements that we continue to receive from a small group of parents when issues reach a critical point for either the person who is the harasser or the victim.

- * It's just **"Boys being Boys"!** This is simply a line to defend a child who is doing the harassment, it is a totally a different story when you are the parents of the victim.
- * "My child is being continually bullied and you have done nothing about it!" When asked has the child or parent contacted the school the answer is 'No, but you should know" Please note we have 640 plus students in the school and I can honestly say that our wonderful staff pick up many but not all issues. Please notify us early so that it does not get out of hand.
- * **"Just ignore it and it will go away".** On some rare occasions this occurs, unfortunately this empowers the bully and places the victim under unnecessary stress. Simply –the earlier we know the better.
- * **"If you tell someone it will only get worse".** How bad can it possibly get! This means that the bully will continue to harass the victim, other students will join in, and probably start on others. I guarantee that if we are notified of bullies they will be dealt with, monitored and punished severely.

Our school values of SAFE, RESPONSIBLE, and RESPECTFUL. Empowering bullies is not responsible, not respectful and clearly not safe. We appeal to all parents to support this great school in making all students enjoy their school life.

Final note - Bullying and Harassment is a personal statement. If an individual feels intimidated or threatened then it is bullying - no matter if we feel it is trivial!

PS I will talk about resilience at another time!

Important Message: Re Aerosols

We have staff at school who have hypersensitivity to many aerosol sprays. Aerosol cans are a banned item at school, so for this reason, students who use aerosols at school inappropriately will be severely punished.
