This is clearly related to 'Science for Everybody', a national aim for Science Education in Australia. The Quiz also aims to encourage participation in a challenging and rewarding activity.

FEE\$ IN ADVANCE LEES IN VDAVICE

The new school financial receipting system allows for funds to be held for students to use at a later date. This is called **Fees in Advance**.

These funds can be used for any student in the same family and remain available from year to year.

Examples of when **Fees in Advance** may be used:

- When an overpayment is made
- When an excursion is cancelled
- If an amount is paid to the school to be used for future fees, excursions etc.

To pay for a student's excursion or activity using **Fees in Advance**, write "Fees in Advance" in the payment method on the excursion note.

A receipt is still issued when utilising **Fees in Advance** to show how payment was made.

Statements of account are mailed out regularly, and any **Fees in Advance** will show up here.

Activity Week 2017-Information for parents







As you know, Activity Week takes place this year between the 11 to the 13 December. We have two groups (Go for Gold and Moreton island) who will also be away for Thursday 14 December. For all other students, however, the Thursday and Friday of that week are normal school days. The Monday and Tuesday of the following week are staff development days with the school being closed to students.

There are many activities that involve swimming or water related participation for Activity Week 2017.

Department of Education guidelines, however, require students to pass a Water Challenge test before participating in water activities. This test will be held at the Moss Vale Indoor pool on the 1 November. It will cost students \$4, to be paid to the front office at school. The permission notes can be picked up outside the PDHPE office. The actual test requires students to complete the following:

- **Entry** Slide in entry into shallow water and walk five metres. (Please note: This is the minimum benchmark for yellow wrist banded students).
- Survival Swimming 25m swim with recognisable strokes.
- Survival Sequence Scull, float or tread water for 1 minute, call out for help once.
- Exit Exit the water unassisted.
- Rescue Sequence Demonstrate a simple voice rescue.

Following completion of 'The Challenge' all students will be classified as either proficient swimmers or non-proficient swimmers. Proficient swimmers will be issued with a blue wrist band on Activity Week and will be deemed safe to participate in the aquatic activity. Non-proficient students will be issued with a yellow wrist band and can participate in shallow water activities. Students must wear these bands for the duration of the water activity. Please note, this applies to all school excursions involving water, not just Activity Week. Once a student completes the water challenge, the results are valid for two terms.

PS-all money for Activity Week was due at the end of last term.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award program is starting again at Moss Vale High School in 2018.



It is an internationally recognised program for young people, building their skills to equip them for life and work. By creating opportunities for young people to develop skills, get physically active, give service and experience adventure, the Award can play a critical role in their development.

The choice to do The Duke of Ed is entirely voluntary and every Award is different. Each participant chooses which activities they want to take part in for each Section. It is a very personal program that offers young people a structure to fulfil their passions and ambitions in a way that suits them.

Apart from the requirements for each Section, and the safety training requirements for the Adventurous Journey Section, the activities a participant chooses to undertake is entirely up to them. They have the freedom to progress through The Duke of Ed according to their personal needs and abilities.

The Award is comprised of three levels (Bronze, Silver and Gold Award) and four sections. Participants complete all four sections at each level in order to achieve their Award. At Gold level, participants also complete a Residential Project.

Service

The Service section of the Award encourages young people to volunteer their time and understand the benefits of this service to their community.

Skills

The Skills section of the Award encourages the development of personal interests and practical and social skills.

Physical Recreation

The Physical Recreation section of the Award encourages young people to participate in sport and other physical recreation for the improvement of health and fitness.

Adventurous Journey

The Adventurous Journey section encourages a sense of adventure whilst undertaking a team journey or expedition. As part of a small team, participants will plan, train for and undertake a journey with a defined purpose in an unfamiliar environment.

Residential Project

The Residential Project, completed only at Gold level, aims to broaden participants' horizons through involvement with others in a residential setting.

If you think your student should consider completing the program, please encourage them to come to the TAS staffroom at school and collect the information and application form.

There will be a Parent/Caregiver information evening held later in the term.
