
Year 10 Dance Assessment

Learning Labs at the University of Wollongong

During the school holidays, I participated in a holiday Learning Lab at the UoW. Over two days, students from all over the state met at the university to join the amazing courses on offer. During my course, Ocean Engineering, I was able to meet new people with similar interests, learn about the theory of oceanic engineering and transportation and then put that new knowledge into use when constructing a sail boat to carry cargo.

ON the first day of the course, my group took part in some ice breaker activities before launching into the Learning Lab material. We learnt the basics of sailing, as well as the structure and function of vital parts of a sailing vessel. Through fun experiments and tests, we learnt about buoyancy, resonance, water displacement and balance on the ocean. All of these elements were vital when we split into groups to create our own sailing boat.

Out brief was to build a vessel from recycled materials that could carry the most cargo (wooden blocks) from one end of the university wave pool to the other in the shortest amount of time. Each group approached the task very differently and by the end of the day we were testing many variations of mon-hull, catamaran, trimaran and barge style vessels. My group chose to combine a mono-hull front with a trimaran back for our boat. We were then able to attach a rudder to the back so we could steer the boat remotely down the wave pool.

Though our boat wasn't the most successful, we still enjoyed constructing and re-evaluating our plans whilst creating it. The course was a great opportunity to not only meet new people and learn about ocean engineering, but also to explore the different options university has to offer. The Learning Lab presenters and the university Student Leaders were all happy to answer questions about every aspect of university life. Spending time on campus helped us to see the amazing facilities and think about university pathways. I thoroughly recommend this opportunity to students.

PARENTS PROVIDING TRANSPORT

There are times when parents may volunteer to provide transport for students other than their own children to excursions, sporting or other events.

This may sometimes mean the difference between whether an activity goes ahead or not. Parents and volunteers providing transport are valued and appreciated by school staff who organise events where a bus is too expensive or not available.

When an excursion or event utilises private transport, by parents, volunteers or school staff, this will be indicated on the permission note under *mode of transport.*

To comply with the Department of Education's policies, the following applies to parents/volunteers and staff providing transport to students other than their own children:

- Current driver's licence provided
- Current vehicle registration provided
- Number of passengers in the vehicle does not exceed the number of seatbelts
- Working with Children Check (WWC) number and date of birth provided
 OR a Declaration for Volunteers completed with 100 points of identity provided

The above information need only be provided once to the school, not for each event, and updated only as documents are renewed.

The Department of Education will accept no liability for any damage to vehicles being used in this manner, including reimbursement for any excess applied by the car owner's insurance company. *NB-comprehensive insurance is not compulsory for parent/volunteers.*

Moss Vale High School policy does not allow students to transport other students or themselves on excursions.


