

Angela Hughes of Year 11, who is part of our new Student Leadership Team, took the initiative to approach staff in the Positive Behaviour for Success team regarding an important fundraiser that she wanted our school community to support. **Angela** attended a luncheon one weekend recently, and heard all about Dignity Ltd which is a not for profit organisation and registered as a charity with the Australian Charities.

The organisation aims to support the dignity of every person, independent of ethnicity, faith, gender, sexuality, age or ability. No human being should have their dignity or freedom compromised. Poverty, hunger, oppression and injustice make it impossible to

live a life commensurate with this dignity. At Dignity Ltd, all their work is people-centred with empowerment at their heart. Their mission is to support people experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness by providing food, shelter, clothing, advocacy and education. Dignity Ltd is particularly aimed at supporting victims of domestic violence, and Angela initiated the 'White Ribbon' fundraiser at our school last week and the \$658.10 proceeds will be passed on to support the great work of Dignity Ltd.



Lorna Anderson and Nellie Waru are another two students who have taken the initiative to highlight the issue of poverty at a recent school assembly. Lorna and Nellie spoke eloquently about the vast number of people in developing countries who do not have basic sanitation, clean water or sufficient food to sustain life. The girls also raised hundreds of dollars for the 40 Hour Famine appeal, including \$191.55 donated by Moss Vale High School students and staff, and all proceeds will go to World Vision to assist in fighting poverty and hunger in some of our poorest countries.

Parents Contacting Students Via Mobile Phone

I would just like to remind everyone about the school's mobile phone policy. Students must have their mobile phone OFF and AWAY in their bag between roll call and period 2 (9am – 11am), (9am–11.20am Assembly week) periods 3-4 (11.20am – 1pm) (11.40–1.10pm Assembly week) and periods 5-6 (1.40pm – 3.20pm) (1.50–3.20pm Assembly week). Parents must understand that their child will not be contactable during these times via their mobile device. We ask that any important messages/changes of routine etc go through the front office, especially if a student is being picked up. Students who are caught with their mobile phone out during these times will have it confiscated and locked in the strongroom to be picked up at the end of school, 3.20pm.
