It is amazing to see how many students are using apps like Snapchat/Instagram/Facebook, when they are not supposed to be old enough to create accounts or have the maturity to use them appropriately. Many students are so tired from being up all night on their devices and not getting the required rest they need. Constable Gary Mutton has delivered a cyber-safety presentation to students and I would encourage parents to have conversations about using social media appropriately and putting in measures at home to help manage screen time to ensure the wellbeing of their child.

Premier's Sporting Challenge

This year Moss Vale High School has registered to participate in the 2018 NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge (PSC). The aim of the Challenge is to encourage students to be more active, more often. Physical activity isn't just about being fit, it's about building resilience, improving concentration and supporting overall health and wellbeing. Students are currently tracking their daily physical activity using the app "PSC Tracker" – available for both android and Apple devices.

Over a ten week period, selected classes will be monitoring physical activity levels during class time at recess and lunch, as well as during sport lessons. Physical activity outside school hours will also count towards the challenge award. The aim is to work towards an average of at least 60 minutes of activity a day for ten weeks.

Students will be rewarded for their sporting effort and achievements based on their weekly physical activity levels. They will be eligible to receive either a Diamond, Gold, Silver or Bronze certificate to celebrate their achievement. We are also working towards a class-based award for the most physically active class and individual at the conclusion of the Challenge.













During the remainder of this term all of Year 8 have been fortunate in being selected to participate in a gymnastics program at the Moss Vale Gymnastics Centre.

Funding was once again secured through the governments' Sporting Schools initiative to the value of \$2500. This money goes toward implementing and enhancing physical activity in schools.

Each class will walk to the venue and be run through three sessions of gymnastics.

Lucy Mapstone (ex-student Moss Vale High School) will be running the students through lots of fun and challenging activities including tumbles, jumps and the use of the trampoline.

A very excited and enthusiastic 8P were the first to attend the program and had a great time navigating the jumps and turns.

A big Thank You to Mr Vandenbergh for organising the funding and co-ordinating the program with Moss Vale Gymnastics.

Melinda Tankard Reist is an author, speaker, media commentator, blogger and advocate for women and girls. She is best known for her work addressing sexualisation, objectification, harms of pornography, sexual exploitation, trafficking and violence against women.

Melinda is author/editor of five books including Getting Real: Challenging the Sexualisation of Girls (Spinifex Press, 2009), now in its 9th printing, Big Porn Inc: Exposing the harms of the global pornography industry (Spinifex Press, 2011, co-edited with Dr Abigail Bray) and her new release (Spinifex Press, co-edited with Dr Caroline Norma) Prostitution Narratives: Stories of survival in the sex trade.

An opinion writer, Melinda is also a regular on morning television and has appeared on ABC's Q&A and The Gruen Sessions as well as many other TV and radio programs. Melinda is co-founder of the grassroots campaigning movement, Collective Shout: for a world free of sexploitation, exposing corporations, advertisers and marketers who objectify women and sexualise girls to sell products and services.

An ambassador for World Vision Australia, Compassion Australia, HagarNZ and the youth mentoring body the Raise Foundation, Melinda is named in the Who's Who of Australian Women and the World Who's Who of Women. She has recently been appointed Senior Lecturer at the Centre for Culture and Ethics, Notre Dame University, Sydney.




