Principal's Report

Term One

We have had a busy and productive term to start the school year. **Mindfulness Mondays** have been initiated whereby all students and staff engage in 5-10 minutes of quiet meditation which is designed to increase overall wellbeing and concentration for more effective learning. We have also established 'vertical' roll calls which means we have students from Years 7 through to 12 in the same group. Through these roll call classes, we are hoping to encourage a greater sense of belonging and assist students in making connections with students from other Years. As part of this initiative, we have re-named the roll call classes as **'Home Groups'** with each of them creating a poster to represent the unique individuals within their Home Group.

The How2Learn initiative is being slowly implemented into our school with staff engaging in professional learning, and by introducing the 'Learning Dispositions' into our classrooms. In Term Two, we will focus on 'Self-regulation'. This is an emotional aspect of learning that recognises that there are certain ways of behaving that help students to stay attached to the learning and give them the best chance of success.

The Positive Behaviour for Success (PBS) team and Student Representative Council (SRC) combined forces to hold a mufti day fundraiser on Friday April 5, for The Smith Family. The theme for the day was 'Heroes' and all proceeds went to this very worthwhile charity to support those struggling with poverty and homelessness. We decided on this charity as a result of the themes in our **Kick off with Reading book**, **No Fixed Address**. The book explores how people can easily slip through the cracks of society and end up homeless, like Felix, the young protagonist in **No Fixed Address**. Congratulations Moss Vale High on raising over \$700 for The Smith Family and for helping others in need.

Year 7 have settled in well to high school life with many of them already accruing their Personal Best Points in the school's Merit System. Due to increased enrolments this year, we have been allocated extra staffing numbers which has allowed us to create an extra Year 7 class, 7 Titan. There are 172 Year 7 students and the current six classes have been almost at capacity. A note has been sent home to the parents of any student who will be making the move across to 7Titan.

Oxley Equestrian Day

The Oxley Equestrian day was held on Sunday, April 7, with a number of our students competing. Scarlett (Year 7) and Vaughan Whatman (Year 9) and Claudia Morris (Year 11). Scarlet Whatman received 1st placings in 2 events. Vaughan received a 4th in dressage, 4th in the AM7 & 3rd in the phase 2 show jumping. Claudia was successful in attaining 1st place in both rounds of Show jumping in her age group and first place in Dressage.

Year 9 & 10 PASS and Year 11 PDHPE Excursion

During Term 1 Year 9 & 10 PASS and Year 11 PDHPE students have been studying units on Body Systems and Body in Motion which explore the anatomy and physiology of the body.


These students attended the Body WORLDS Vital exhibition held in Sydney Town Hall. The exhibition presents a special collection of real-life human bodies designed to show visitors the basics of human health and wellness. It includes whole-body plastinates, a large arrangement of individual organs, arterial and organ configurations and translucent slices that give a complete picture of how the body works.

BODY WORLDS Vital use modern plastination body technology as a tool to enhance the study of human anatomy. Students were able to see how a healthy body works as well as the effects of lifestyle choices. For instance, they could see the effects of smoking on the lungs, and how muscles work together during exercise as well as how disease and ageing can affect the different body systems. The body systems explored throughout the exhibition included the locomotive/muscular system, nervous system, respiratory system, cardiovascular system and digestive system.

This year the boys redeemed themselves, maintaining their composure and they can hold their heads high as they overcame an unruly Bowral team to defeat them 3-1 and progress to the second round for the first time since 2014! The boys travel to Goulburn on the last day of term, to face off against their fierce rivals at Mulwaree High School with Ms Middleton.



The **Girls Open Soccer Team** took on Bowral High late in the term, taking them down 2-0. It was a tough game, however, led by their captain Jemma Coulter, the girls found their groove in the second half. They took control of the game and spent 80 % of the second half in their opponent's half. Taylah Denford scored the two winning goals. 






Look at these fabulous models of Year 8 Ag Eggs!






