Principal's Report

It was wonderful to have all our students and staff return on 25 May 2020 after weeks of remote teaching and learning. I want to again thank everyone in our school community for their patience, understanding, adaptability and resilience during this challenging time. In week 7 we had our first virtual assembly as we were still unable to hold a full school assembly under current COVID 19 restrictions, and it was a huge success. My address for the assembly has been included in this newsletter below. I would like to thank Ms Victoria Hansen for all her hard work in filming, editing and producing our virtual assembly. We will be holding another virtual assembly to end the term and celebrate our school's achievements over the past weeks.

I would like to welcome Mrs Tammy Jovanov who has joined our TAS faculty through a rigorous merit selection process, and she has taken the substantive position that was previously filled by Mr Robert Berman. Mrs Jovanov started in week 6 and is settling in well with her classes.

Due to the disruptions of COVID 19, the Department of Education has allowed schools to have more time in order to finalise the semester one reports. Our students will be receiving their reports by week three of next term. The reports will have a new format which we are trialling and have shown this to our P&C representatives. The new format will also be used for semester two reports, after which we will be seeking feedback from parents. Parent Teacher evenings were unable to be held for semester one, also due to the COVID restrictions. However, we will definitely be holding a Parent Teacher evening in term four so that parents can engage in face to face discussions with teachers regarding their child's performance for 2020.

The Subject Selection evening for Years 8 and 10 was also affected by the COVID restrictions and we are hoping to hold this as early as possible in term three. A date will be confirmed at the start of the term.

Please be aware that the first Monday of next term, 20 July, will be a Staff Development Day and students will return on Tuesday 21 July.

Finally, I know it has been an unusual, disrupted and challenging term for all members of our school community and their families. I ask that our students and staff take time over the school holidays to recharge and prepare, both mentally and physically, for the next semester. I wish everyone a safe and happy holiday. Take care!

Good morning Staff and Students and welcome to our first virtual assembly.

I'm sure we can all agree that 2020 has been a somewhat challenging and even difficult year so far. We started the year with the horrific bushfires that affected most of our country and even impacted our own local community. Then, as we all know, the world was hit by the COVID 19 pandemic that appeared to rapidly spread throughout many countries including Australia. Life changed for all of us to varying degrees for a relatively short period of time, at least in this country. I want to acknowledge and thank our teachers and support staff who all worked incredibly hard to ensure that our students were able to learn remotely. When students didn't have a device or internet connectivity, our staff ensured that they received hard copies of work. If students weren't engaging with work, their teachers and Year Advisers let us know so that there was a combined effort to reach out and look after every student's wellbeing as much as we possibly could under these unusual and challenging conditions. I am grateful for having my job, for being in such a great school with such wonderful students and staff. I'm grateful for my health and the health of those I love and care about. I'm also grateful that I live in a country where overall the pandemic was managed in a careful and consistent manner, and that we have had a relatively low number of deaths, particularly in comparison to other countries like America, Italy, the UK and Spain. I hope that all of you and the wider community are grateful for our teachers and our schools that play such an important part in the fabric of our society.

I want you all to value the incredible right you all have to an education. Don't take it or your teachers for granted. In many countries around the world there are millions of children that do not have access to an education.

I think we all need to be grateful for living in a country where we have a comparatively peaceful and united national community. I feel I must mention the global outrage that has been witnessed and demonstrated in response to the killing of George Floyd, an African American man who died as a consequence of the most horrific and blatant act of police brutality on the streets of Minneapolis. I mention this as it has not only impacted America but the world. Apart from being grateful, we also need to remember that we must always do whatever we can to stand peacefully and responsibly against all forms of hatred, injustice, violence and inequality.

If ever there was a time to be kind and compassionate towards each other- the time is now.

- Past years' photographs, including sports, co-curricular and representative groups available at school's **advancedlife** & your **advancedyou** photo sites (follow the link above)



Member for Goulburn Wendy Tuckerman and Wingecarribee Shire Mayor Duncan Gair officially opened the brand-new Bundanoon Skate Park on 1 June 2020.

"This is an absolutely fabulous facility that I'm sure our Shire's youth will enjoy for years to come," Mayor Gair said.

"I'm particularly pleased at the range of elements that have been included in the park ensuring skaters of all abilities can enjoy it."

During the opening the Mayor thanked the project's many contributors.

"The staff of Council and contractors have done a wonderful job in delivering this project," he said. "I also thank the Member for Goulburn for supporting us and helping secure the funds for the project."

"I would however save my final praise for the local community, in particular the youth of Bundanoon," he added.

"The entire village got right behind young Tyson Robb and his mates and deserve full credit for their passion, patience and enthusiasm."

Construction on the \$416,304 project began in late 2019 but was delayed due to the impact of the Morton Bush Fire, record rains and more recently the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mrs Tuckerman said the NSW Government's commitment to funding amenities that improve everyday life in the regions has delivered new and improved infrastructure like the skatepark, pathways, cycleways and sporting fields.

"The Stronger Country Communities Fund delivers smaller projects that make a big difference to everyday life, and with social distancing allowing communities to stay healthy and exercise outside, I'd say that difference is now more noteable than ever," Mrs Tuckerman said.

"Projects like the Bundanoon Skate Park are priceless to our local communities – I am delighted that the Wingecarribee Shire Council have completed the project."

An official community event celebrating the project will be held when further social distancing restrictions are eased.

The Bundanoon Skate Park is located within the Bundanoon Oval precinct on Erith Street in Bundanoon.

The Bundanoon Skate Park is a joint project by Wingecarribee Shire Council with funding provided via the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund including design by California Skate Parks and specialised construction by Trinity Skate Parks.






Our Year 11 PDHPE class have continued their studies into different fitness activities available for specific groups. Our second group guided the class through a low impact pregnancy circuit.

SICK BAY

The health and well being of our students is always of utmost importance.

During this period of COVID-19 Coronavirus we are following Department of Education guidelines:

"Students who are unwell upon arrival to school, such as a fever, cough, runny nose and/or any other symptoms, where possible deny entry to the school or direct them to an area so they are isolated from others at the school. Arrangements are to be made for them to be sent home or leave the school in the care of an appropriate person as soon as possible.

Students who develop symptoms of illness and become unwell during the day are to be isolated in an appropriate area.

Arrangements are to be made for them to be sent home or leave the school in the care of an appropriate person as soon as possible."

The Sick Bay will only be used for First Aid treatment of students who sustain injuries while at school.

Our group installation 'US' was created to project a sense of unity within our school. Not just between the students but the teachers and all staff and personnel within our school. Through unity, kindness sprouts. And like one small butterfly flapping its wings leading to a monumental event, one small act of kindness can lead to an even bigger one.

For 'The Message Tree' we decided to use old magazines and paint over them using gesso. We did this for two reasons, first, we didn't want to waste resources and secondly, we wanted new messages over the old ones. We used gesso to paint over the magazines and sewed the strips together. We aimed for the messages to look like they were seeping through cracks or holes in the tree. The messages were quotes from people who we found inspiring and/or people who had influenced or helped us over the years, whether that be from the things they physically do for the world or the messages they help to spread. Now the message tree passes these on to you!





'Escape From Now'. Emily Waring, Hazel McGlynn, Amber Wood & Piper Shields

Titled 'Escape From Now', our work aims to represent themes of freedom, hope, peace and kindness. This takes symbolic form within the white birds used in our piece. Taking inspiration from our physical environment, our group has worked with Moss Vale High School's core themes and values along with the school's traditions and practices to develop an interesting and eye-catching installation piece. One major influence into the planning stage of our installation was the school's annual kick off with reading event, in which each student is given a copy of a book. This year the book was 'White Bird'. Our installation borrows key elements and ideas from the novel. As quoted from the book:

'In times where it takes courage to be kind, kindness becomes a miracle. It becomes that light in the darkness... the very essence of our humanity. It is hope.'

The wave shape shown by the birds is symbolic of imagination and the ever-flowing nature of humanity. The wave is designed to make the birds look as if they are in flight representing how reading makes our imagination 'take flight'. Our design also incorporates the library environment by using book pages to create the birds. The white birds symbolise freedom in the face of adversity, commenting on the current global and political issues we currently face.

It is this theme which we want to showcase most to Moss Vale High School, that, even in times such as now when things are difficult, kindness can provide an escape. Simple acts of humanity are all it takes to bring hope into difficult times. This is what we hope the image of the wave of flying birds will evoke, moving on from and escaping the difficult times or, escaping from now.

Our artwork symbolises how small we feel as people in the world we live in today. With the use of small figurines, we portray our feelings towards society and its standards. 



If we each commit to support one activity during the year, the difference we will make will be significant – and it will allow the P & C to fund the extras that will make the educational experience of our children even more enjoyable.


