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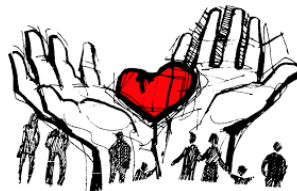

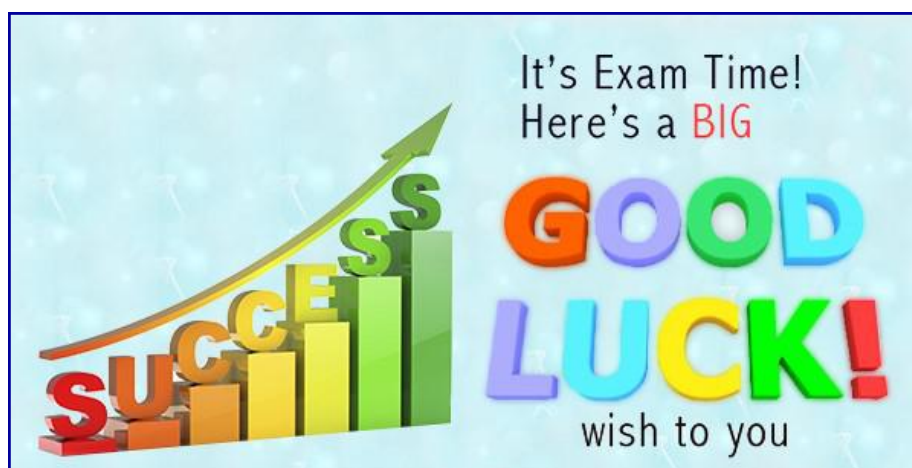

Principal Report

Year 12

Our wonderful Year 12 students are fast approaching the end of their high school career. However, as parents would be aware, they have an additional week at the start of term four to make some compensation for time lost due to remote learning earlier in the year. In that first week, we will hold a farewell virtual assembly on Thursday, October 15 and the Graduation will be held on the following day, October 16. The Department of Education gave schools the choice to hold graduations before the HSC exams or after November 12, in the hope that parents may be able to attend in a COVID-safe manner after the exams. We held a meeting with all Year 12 students to put the options to them and allowed them to make the final choice. Year 12 students felt that it would feel somewhat anticlimactic to finish their schooling on October 16 and wait until after November 12 to graduate. At this stage, the plan is to hold a live graduation assembly for students and Year 12 teachers which will be filmed and shared with parents. Obviously, if the Department of Education announces any changes that will allow parents to attend the earlier graduations, then we will notify parents immediately.



The good news is that the students can go ahead as planned with their formal in November. I am extremely proud of Year 12 and how well the students have coped with the many changes and challenges of 2020. I wish them well as they move towards their final exams and life beyond Moss Vale High School. They will be missed!

Due to COVID restrictions, we have been continuing with our virtual assemblies and even held the incoming captains induction via a virtual assembly. I would again like to congratulate Matt Johnston, Makayla Jones, Matthew Kelly and Isabel Nash on their official induction into their new roles. R U OK

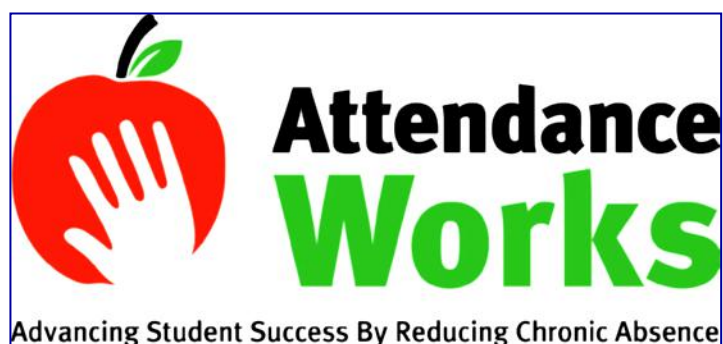

Attendance



I know this has been a difficult year with COVID and this has definitely impacted on student attendance. However, I would ask parents to support our efforts in encouraging students to attend school each day unless there is a genuine reason such as illness or family emergency. I would also ask that parents ensure that their child's absence is explained as quickly as possible after the date of absence. Regular attendance at school is essential if students are to maximise their potential. Schools, in partnership

with parents, are responsible for promoting regular attendance of students. While parents are legally responsible for the regular attendance of their children, school staff, as part of their duty of care, monitor part or whole day absences.

Reports

Student Semester One reports for Years 7-10 were published several weeks ago and looked different to past reports. These reports, as mentioned in previous newsletters, did not contain a written comment but they should still have communicated vital information to parents regarding their child's level of achievement in each subject and strategies for achievement.

This change was made in consultation with the schools Parents and Citizens Association, and the P&C has agreed to this report format being used in semester two for Years 7-10 reports only. One of the main components of this agreement was an undertaking that a parent survey would be part of this process, and parents could voice their opinion as to whether this style of report should be used in 2021 or if we should return to the previous format. We will ensure parents receive the survey link via the parent portal and school website.

The decision to streamline the reporting process for semesters one and two of 2020 was not made lightly, and the executive team took into consideration the disruptions of remote learning and the undue stress and workload that has resulted for our teachers this year. We strongly believe that the new style reports will communicate detailed information to parents about their child's progress and achievement in each subject. If parents require any further information they are very welcome to contact teachers personally via phone or email. Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 restrictions we have been unable to hold a face to face Parent-Teacher evening for semester one and it looks unlikely that we will be able to hold a Parent-Teacher evening in term four, based on current COVID guidelines for schools. However, we will update parents if these restrictions change.

Thank you, Mr Nash!

I would like to thank Mr Matt Nash for leading the HSIE faculty for the good part of three years. He has done an outstanding job in this leadership role that he has juggled with his responsibilities of organising our annual Activity Week. Mr Nash will be stepping back from the role as Ms Ashlee Randall returns from maternity leave at the start of term four to take up the substantive Head Teacher position. Ms Randall will be returning in a part time capacity for the time being and will be sharing the role with Ms Alexandra Bateman.

I wish all members of our school community a happy, relaxing and safe holiday. I wish Year 12 all the best with their studies and I look forward to seeing all staff and students back on Monday 12 October, as there is NO Staff Development Day at the start of term four.

Deputy Principals Report

In this last newsletter of Term 3, Mr Carlyon and I would like to focus on our Year 12 students, the impressive student work which has been occurring across our classrooms, and also planning for the introduction of our BYOD (Bring Your Own Device Program) in 2021.

As our **Year 12 students** approach the end of their schooling, we would like to acknowledge the tremendous upheaval they have navigated this year. It has certainly been an HSC year like no other, and they have come together as a cohort to support each other through the unique challenges they have faced. We would also like to acknowledge and thank all of our Year 12 teachers, who have worked overtime this year to shift their curriculum into the virtual space, while ensuring that their students were supported during the time of uncertainty. We wish our Year 12 students all the very best as they move into the workforce or further education.

One of the most rewarding aspects of the Deputy Principal role is being invited into classrooms to see what our students have achieved and produced. **Year 9 PDHPE** students recently held a very impressive **Health Expo**, setting up stalls in the hall and surrounding areas. We were very impressed with the level of research, deep subject knowledge and informative resources created by the year group. Congratulations to our **Year 12 students** who have recently submitted their **major works in Visual Arts and Timber**, and completed their performances in **Music, Drama and Dance**. Congratulations should also go to **Nic Hamilton** of Year 7 who has demonstrated a strong growth mindset to **improve in Mathematics**, and was able to describe the learning strategies he employed to develop his level of knowledge and understanding.

In 2021 Moss Vale High School will be introducing a **BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) Policy** for all students. As education continues to evolve to suit the needs of our students in the present and the future, it is becoming essential for students to use their own device on a daily basis. "Bring your own device (BYOD) refers to technology models where students bring a personally owned device to school for the purpose of learning. A personally owned device is any technology device brought into the school and owned by a student (or the student's family), staff or guests" (Alberta Education, 2012). Put simply, BYOD is a solution where students quite literally bring their own device to school in order to access the internet by the school Wi-Fi. Mobile phones are not considered an acceptable device.

Our recommended specifications are as follows.

The device should be:

- Laptop or a 2-in-1 device.
- (For Windows Devices - minimums) Windows, 4GB RAM, 1Ghz processor, 32GB of free hard drive space.
- (For Mac Devices - minimums) OS X 10.9* 4GB RAM, 1Ghz processor, 32GB of free hard drive space.
- iPad or Android Tablets with external keyboard, or a Chromebook. Please note, that there are some concerns about the long-term functionality of these devices and ease of network connectivity.
- Battery Life of 6+ hours.
- Light weight, under 1.5 kg
- 12" or larger screen.
- Dual Band Wi-Fi with a/g/b/n.
- Pre-loaded with the Microsoft Suite (students have free access to Microsoft 365 from the Student Portal)
- Ability to connect earphones/head phones under teacher instruction.

We are committed to delivery of the same learning outcomes for all our students whatever their family's financial circumstances. We have developed an Equity Policy to operate alongside our BYOD Policy. The Equity Policy outlines a number of strategies the school may take, in consultation with you, to support access to information and communication technologies (ICT).

Further detailed information will be provided to all parents early in Term 4, 2020.

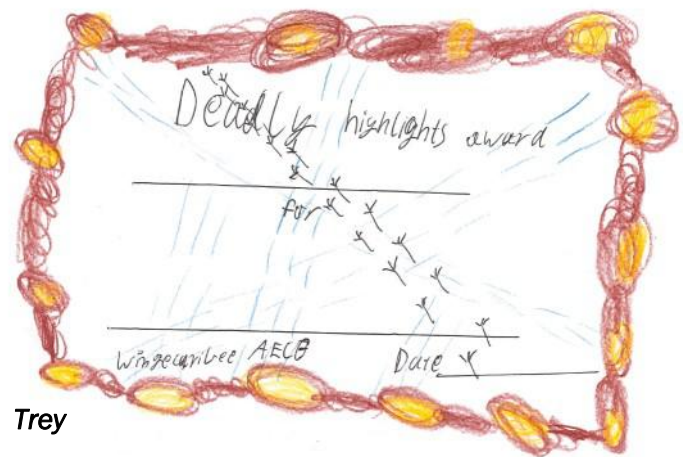


Deadly Highlights Art Competition

Students were dressed to impress and had some amazing dance moves. The judges had a tough job in announcing the winners with such high standards.

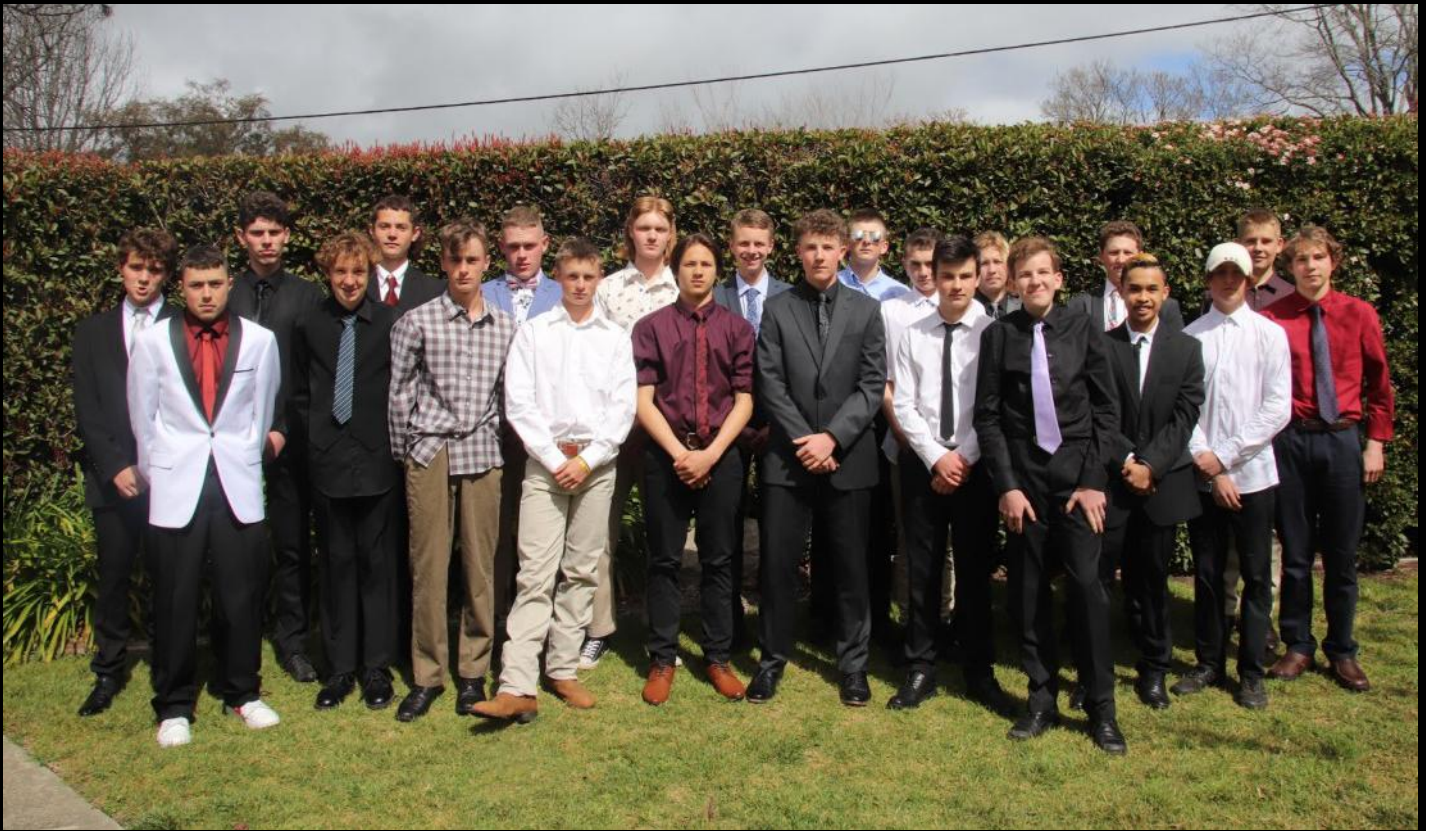

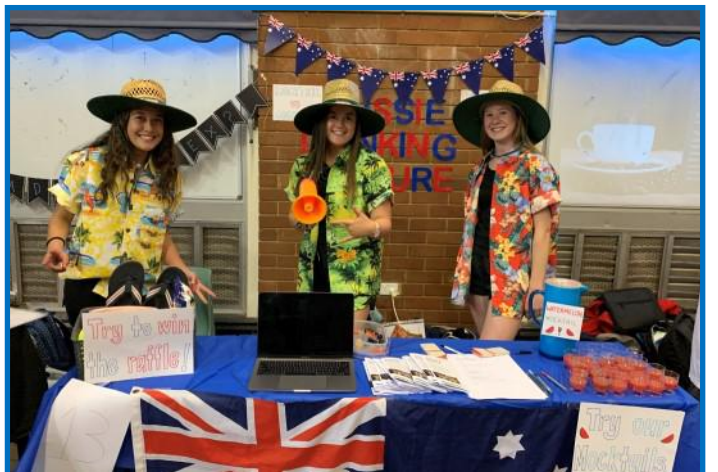

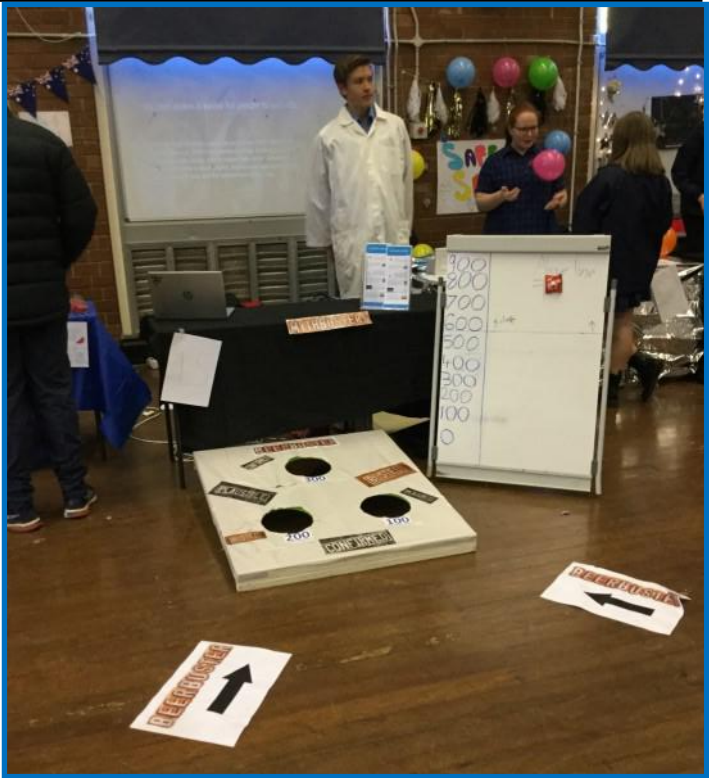

Minnamurra River Biology Field Trip



Crabs, Quadrats, Fishing

This term, Year 11 Biology were lucky enough to go on an excursion to Minnamurra River to investigate the local ecosystem as part of their depth study. It was a muddy affair and students had to gear up in some specialised crocs and gum boots for the occasion. Our guide, Steve, told us all about the adaptations of plants and animals in the local area. We then helped him and his team at the Illawarra Education Centre by collecting data on the abundance and distribution using randomized quadrats and transects. Steve then discussed the future of the area and the impacts of rising sea levels and ways of minimising the impacts.

After all our hard work, some students instructed Mr Grehan on how to fish... while others went crabbing in the sand and hunting for other organisms.

As part of their depth study, students then had to create a website aimed at educating the community about the Minnamurra ecosystem. It is an honour to say that two of our students have been selected as exemplar samples for the Illawarra Education Centre. Miss Quinn is immensely proud of her students and the hard work they put into their learning, despite the difficulties and disruptions this year had thrown at them.

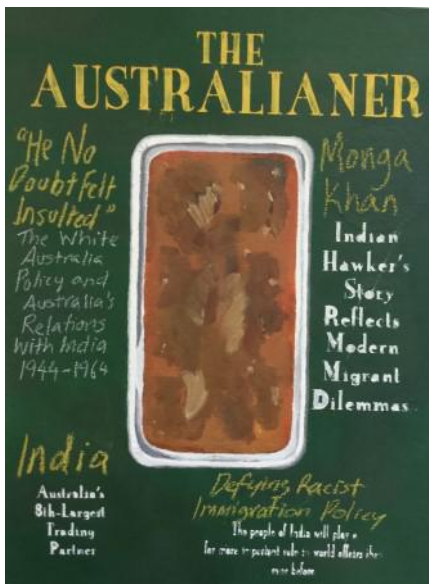




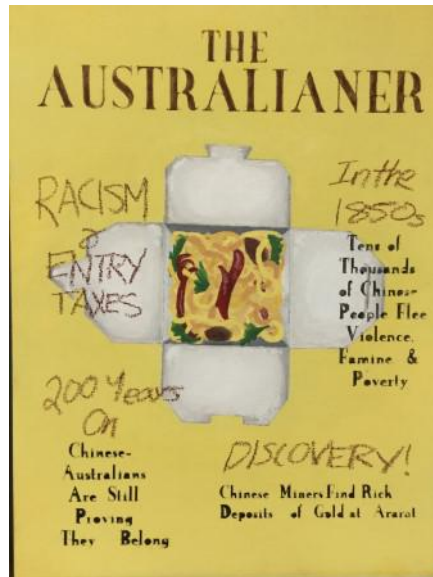
