## **Principal's Report**

#### Welcome back- Better Than Ever

The start of the 2021 school year has begun very smoothly but, as usual, it has also been very busy. Our Year 7 students have settled in nicely with lots of nurturing support from their Year Adviser, Ms Middleton. All students have been gifted a school diary and a wellbeing journal to help with planning, organisation and looking after their mental health. I would like to thank our wonderful P&C for donating the vast majority of the funds for these important student resources.



We have already held our school swimming carnival where students got into the spirit of the day whether through participation in events or through cheering on their house competitors. The weather was not the best on the day but I appreciate all the students who made an effort to attend. Swimming and Athletics Carnivals are a school day and attendance at these events are compulsory unless a student has a valid reason to be absent.

Our theme for 2021 is '**Better Than Ever**', derived from our 2020 end of year school film. We know that last year was challenging for many of us due to the summer bushfires and then the disruption of COVID-19. Therefore, we wanted to come back with a positive mindset and a renewed focus on our strong values and high expectations at MVHS.

#### Positive Behaviour for Success

Our Positive Behaviour initiative is all about giving our students skills and values to be positive and successful members of society. We want them to also understand that it is important to try and make a positive difference in the world around them by helping others out in whichever way they can. One way in which we do this is through holding a Mufti-Fundraiser each term to raise funds for worthy causes and charities. ## **Deputy Principals Report**

Welcome back!

A warm welcome back to all our school community as we start the 2021 school year. Our Year 7 students have quickly settled in and have taken on the added layers of personal responsibility required in the high school learning environment. It has been pleasing to see all students in full school uniform and with the required equipment each day.

This year we have purchased a student diary and wellbeing journal for each student. The student diary contains the student handbook, daily planning pages, weekly wellbeing and learning tips, as well as pages to record uniform and out of class passes. Students should carefully read through their diary so they are clear on school rules and expectations. They are expected to bring their diary to school each day. The wellbeing journal is kept here at school and will be used during Home Group lessons during the week. The wellbeing journal provides weekly activities for students to complete focusing on growth mindset, mindfulness, respectful relationships, character strengths, goal setting and gratitude. We thank the P&C for their generous donation of \$9,000 to assist us in providing these valuable resources for our students.

2021 has marked the start of formally implementing a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) policy at Moss Vale High. We are already seeing benefits in learning as students are able to utilise their own device in classes throughout the day. Thank you to the vast majority of families who are supporting their child to bring a charged, suitable device each day. A reminder that if you are unable to purchase a device for your child due to financial concerns, you should contact the school and organise a meeting with the principal so that we can discuss options to support your child here at school.

All students who are riding bicycles or scooters to school are reminded that it is a legal requirement to wear a helmet. Students who ride to school without a helmet will be unable to ride home, and parents will be called to collect the bicycle or scooter and organise an alternate method for the student to travel home.

## What's new in Term 1? - Canvas

The 2020 lockdown and online learning provided us with beneficial feedback on the necessity to maintain and use a quality learning management system. After careful consideration of the different options available we made the decision to say goodbye to Edmodo and introduce Canvas as our new learning management system. Year 12 students and MVHS teachers were introduced to Canvas in Term 4 2020 with the remainder of the school introduced to the system in Term 1 2021.

Canvas is a learning management system that provides teachers, students and parents/caregivers with a platform to share and communicate teaching, learning and assessment activities and resources. This does not mean it replaces the classroom teacher or workbooks and pens, it is a learning and teaching tool that can be used in the classroom or at home to support and supplement learning experiences that are occurring in the classroom.

In 2021 teachers have been asked to use Canvas to:

- Notify students and parents/caregivers of assessment tasks and submission requirements.
- Inform students and parents/caregivers of the learning intentions/outcomes/content for a unit of work.
- Upload subject documentation, textbooks, topic notes and other resources.
- Upload homework tasks and revision materials.
- Outline basic instructions and/or lesson content for students and parents/caregivers if a student is absent for an extended period, for example student suspensions, approved leave or extended illness.

By Week 4 Term 1 all students had been introduced to Canvas and instructed on how it will be used for their different subjects. Although not mandatory, students who have their own device are encouraged to use Canvas during lessons as it provides a more interactive learning experience. Alternate resources have been provided for students who do not have a device, but we highly recommend students bring their own device whenever possible. Families who are struggling to meet BYOD requirements are reminded to contact Mrs Holmes to discuss how the school could support and assist student access to digital learning devices.

Students access Canvas using their DoE email and password, any student who has yet to login to Canvas is encouraged to do so ASAP. On a web browser (e.g. Chrome or Safari) go to

Alternately students can download the Canvas student app from the app store for Android and iOS devices. Login using the same username and password as they would on a browser.

We encourage parents/caregivers to join our Canvas community as observers. This can be done through a web browser as per the instructions provided on the next page or by downloading the Canvas Parent app from the app store on an Android or iOS device. A join code is required to create an account, this can be accessed through a student account as per the instructions on the next page. Click on the link below to find out more about the Canvas Parent app.

## Parent Guide - joining Canvas and linking student accounts

It is recommended that you perform the following steps in a web browser (not Explorer) before downloading the Canvas Parent App.

#### Task 1 - Generate and record an observer join code

Step 1 – ask your son/daughter to login to their Canvas account

Step 2 – select Account from the left hand menu bar then select Settings



Step 3 - click on the button on the right hand side of the page

Step 4 – this will generate a dialog box containing the following message and a code, write down or copy the code and keep it safe as you will need it once you have created an account in Canvas.



## Task 2 - To register a new account with Canvas and join your account to your son/daughter account

Step 1 – This is Moss Vale High School's Canvas institution login page, you will need to go here to register a new account. Once you have created an account you can login through the Canvas parent app.

Once you navigate to the school's Canvas website you will need to click on this link to take you to the window that will allow you to create an account with Canvas.

Step 2 – Complete the Parent Signup form to register a new account. You will need to enter a pairing code from at least one of your children's Canvas accounts (as instructed in Task 1) to complete the registration.

**Engineering Flowchart** 







Engineers have an old saying that if it moves and it is not meant to, gaffer tape is your solution. Scientists can see the logic in this thinking but have found an alternate solution. Read on to find out why.

Year 9 have made a great start to 2021 Science. The first topic we have been investigating is "Energy on the Move" which is about the ways in which energy moves through matter and space, mainly by the means of waves. Several classes engaged with the topic by building their own "wave machine". Sounds complicated? Actually all it required was some bamboo skewers, a bag of jelly babies and a roll of gaffer tape. After spearing a jelly baby onto each end of a skewer, students attached them at intervals along a length of gaffer tape that was stretched between two chairs. Now for the wave demonstration! Applying a disturbance by flicking one of the sticks caused a wave to flow from one end of the wave machine to the other. The energy from twisting that first section of the tape moved to the next bit which twisted, and then the next. The wave moved while the jelly babies stayed close to their original positions. Students explored how the wave could be altered to observe the frequency, wavelength and speed of the waves. Amazing though the science was, most students agreed that the highlight of the prac was getting to eat their jelly babies at the end. Of course, all this was managed with great attention to hygienic and covid-safe practices.

Now let's see if we can design a prac around the other half of the engineers flowchart: WD-40!

Each of our core teachers will be conducting Individual Education Program (IEP) meetings with our students' parents/carers and Allied Health Professionals over the next few weeks, to further tailor our programs to cater for individual needs and update student IEP's for 2021.

Each student who joined our unit this year, participated in the 'Transition Program' organised by our Head Teacher Tim Vandervoort, towards the end of 2020. This gave our students regular sessions at Moss Vale High School to get used to their new environment and a chance to meet their future teachers. The students got to experience a little of each of their future subjects within the Support Unit during these taster days and they were given the opportunity to become more familiar with one another and the current students already in the Support Unit. Students were given tours of the school to assist them to be more comfortable in a much larger school environment. They participated in specific learning activities within the Support Unit and given social interaction opportunities to help ease their transition into their new educational environment. Parents/carers were also given a chance to meet and greet the Support Unit staff and given an overview of how the Support Unit operates.

The start of 2021 has proven to be a smooth and successful beginning for our lovely new students. They have faced some fears and they have overcome the discomfort of settling into a new school environment, extremely well. We are so very proud of each and every one of our students for their efforts and courage and also equally as proud of our continuing students who have made a great effort to help our new students feel comfortable, make new friends and feel welcome.

Our Support Unit this year consists of four core class teachers who are responsible for teaching English and Maths plus many additional subjects. The core teachers are Tim Vandervoort (Head Teacher) who is responsible for Mossy class and Design and Technology, Jim Good responsible for Bundy class and Sport and PE, Fiona Lovett responsible for Robbo Class and Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) and Kate Regan who is responsible for Exeter Class and History. We also have two teachers who teach additional subjects Anita Austin for Science and Geography and Natalia Cricri for Personal Development and Agriculture. All teachers help in the teaching of either ITC (Information Technology and Communication) and/or TAS (Technology and Applied Science) and LOTE (Languages Other than English). We are very fortunate to also have Deb Brennan continuing to work with us in the Support Unit in the role of Vision Itinerant Teacher, working with two of our vision impaired students in the Robbo Class. It has been a wonderful start to Semester 1, as we get to know our new students and they get to know our teachers and SLSO's (School Learning Support Officers).

## **'COVERDRIVE' SPORTS UPDATE - INCLUSIVITY**

# STUDENTS REQUIRING MEDICATION DURING SCHOOL HOURS

If your child is participating in a school excursion or activity away from school, and requires medication during school hours:

- Please send a note with your child on the day of the excursion or activity detailing what medication, how much and when to be taken
- Please send only the day's medication, clearly labelled with your child's name and dosage information



- Your child should give the note and medication to the supervising teacher as soon as they arrive at the excursion or activity designated meeting place
- Any medication held at school for your child will not be accessible to the excursion or activity supervising teacher

## **PROCESS FOR STUDENTS LEAVING SCHOOL**

- Parents should contact the school with details of why the student is leaving; whether they are going to another school, further education or employment.
- Parents will then receive a form to complete any missing details eg name of new school, future address, employer letter etc. This form will also list any outstanding books and/or fees.
- When the completed form is returned and all outstanding items are resolved, the school will remove the student from active enrolment (unless the student is going to attend another NSW Government school in which case the new school will notify MVHS when the student commences enrolment).
