Deng Adut's Visit

The definite highlight of this term was the visit by Deng Adut to our school on Thursday 27 April. The staff and students at Moss Vale High School were honoured and privileged to have the author, child soldier and criminal lawyer, Deng Adut, visit for the entire school day. Deng wrote the inspirational and moving book, Songs of a Warboy, a book our school community has been reading as part of our long-standing Kick off with Reading program (KOWR). The KOWR started in 2014 and involves the same book being gifted to every student and staff member. The Positive Behaviour for Success team has always ensured that each book that has been chosen over the years, has communicated important social justice messages. These books and their messages form the basis of our Positive Behaviour for Success lessons throughout the first semester of each year.

Whilst Deng visited, he spoke to the school community at two separate assemblies, visited classes and happily signed hundreds of books. He took the time to chat with students informally during breaks and graciously posed for countless photos. We are all extremely grateful to have been able to hear, first-hand, of Deng's experiences and his inspiring messages of love, resilience, forgiveness and the potential for education to positively change a human being's life. In order to thank Deng for his generosity, time and wisdom, our school community held a fundraiser on Friday of week 9 this term, with all proceeds to go to Deng Adut's John Mac Foundation. This is a non-profit organisation which is focussed on helping to educate and empower refugees whose lives have been interrupted by war.


ACTIVITY WEEK 2023

Attendance

As winter progresses, we have noticed a significant decline in student attendance as cold and flu viruses prevail. Students are always encouraged to stay home if

sick, as necessary, but are reminded to ensure they maintain a positive attendance pattern as much as possible. Mental health, birthday, refusal to attend school are not justified reasons for school absence. The NSW Department of Education *School Attendance Policy* states that regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential and encouraging regular attendance is a core school responsibility.

Years 8, 9 and 10 Subject Selection

At the beginning of Term 3 students in Years 8, 9 and 10 will participate in subject selection processes, providing them with the opportunity to choose some, or all, of the subjects they undertake in 2024. This is an important milestone for many students as it is the first

Important Notices regarding procedures @ Moss Vale High School:

Sick Bay

Changes to our process of dealing with students who present to our administration office feeling unwell:

- Students will be logged on our Sentral system and assessed.
- Basic first aid treatments will be administered where appropriate.
- If deemed unable to remain in class, parents / caregivers will be contacted to collect their child.
- Students will be waiting in the administration foyer for pick-up.

Early Leavers

- Students are expected to be at school all day, every day, unless they are seriously ill or have other extenuating circumstances.

If students are required to leave early the following procedure needs to be adhered to:

- Parents to notify the school via a note with your child, a phone call, email or via Sentral portal messages **before 9am.**
- An early leaver slip will be generated at the Administration Office, which will be given to your child.
- Students present the slip to be excused from class at the correct time.

Blazers & Ties

Students who wish to borrow a school blazer and/or tie, will need to go to the Administration Office in their break times, the day prior to requiring the uniform items. These Items are NOT to be kept by students for extended periods of time.

Rose Shaw from Community Circles and Pam Luke, a prominent local artist, brought in many different weaving options for the students to try. They were able to use traditional methods to make bracelets, baskets and bowls.

Our Connection Crew students had a fantastic time, and we greatly appreciate the time and effort of Greg, Pam and Rose put in to working with, and educating our First Nations students. We encourage any First Nations students who would like to join our Connection Crew to come and see Mrs Tilden.














Year 7 Rainbow Tubes

Year 7 have been investigating the topic "states of matter" in which they explore the physical property of density. Density is the amount of matter packed into a space. Classes 7A and 7S were given the task of identifying the differences in density of four coloured mystery liquids, and then using this knowledge to construct a "rainbow tube". Students used their science skills to work out the correct density order of the liquids by carefully adding one liquid to the other and seeing which colour floated and which sank. This knowledge was then used to fill a test tube with clearly separated coloured liquids, with blue at the bottom and yellow at the top. The true identity of the liquids was kept secret and there much chatter and debate about what they were. Once the prac was completed, all was revealed -- the mystery liquids were nothing more than water with different amounts of salt (and food colouring, of course). Judging by the broad smiles and active engagement in the lesson, it was clear that everyone enjoyed themselves.























Y12 Esters Prac

Carbon is found in more places and in more forms than any other element. More than 90 per cent of compounds known to chemists are carbon compounds, and the study of these organic compounds has been the focus of Year 12 Chemistry in term 2. One of the most eagerly anticipated (and smelly) investigations was the production of esters from the chemical reaction of alcohol and carboxylic acid.

This involved safely heating highly flammable reagents to accelerate the reaction rate, and then purifying to extract the final product. The smell of the ester was so distinctive that adjoining classes correctly identified that it had the aroma of banana lollies. Success!








Year 10 Science and Engineering Challenge

On Monday 22 May, 27 Year 10 students participated in the problem solving competition that is the Science and Engineering Challenge organised by the University of Newcastle and supported by the Bowral-Mittagong Rotary. The Science and Engineering Challenge encourages students to consider a career in science or engineering, and to study the enabling sciences in senior high school. I would like to congratulate all the students on participating positively and for being active learners.





























NSW Titration Competition

On Saturday 17 June, six of our Y12 Chemistry students competed in the NSW Titration Competition at Nowra Anglican College. This is the first time in recent years that Moss Vale High School has entered this competition and it proved to be a fantastic experience. Students competed in teams of three, with each responsible for precisely measuring (to four decimal places) concentration of one of three different acetic acid solutions. To achieve this, they used a primary standard of hydrochloric acid to standardise a sodium hydroxide solution, which was then used to measure the acetic acid solution. This involved meticulous washing and rinsing of all glassware, up to eight individual titrations, calculations, all within a strict 90-minute window.





Our two teams were exemplary ambassadors for our school with their willingness to have a go, deal with set-backs, show good sportsmanship, and enjoy themselves. My unwritten goals for our teams were: 1) at least half the students achieve a value for the acetic acid, 2) at least one to be close to their correct value, and 3) to experience the event and have a bit of fun with it! Mission accomplished. Huge congratulations to Maddison Coulter for achieving a result that was only 0.5% too high.

It was amazing to see what other teams were able to achieve. All three members of the winning team from Nowra Anglican College achieved concentrations that perfectly matched the verified concentrations. They only lost points for the range of deviation in their individual measurements, and one student achieved a perfect score of 0 points. Phenomenal!

Afterwards, we took the opportunity the extend our Organic Chemistry studies by visiting the Manildra Ethanol plant at Bomaderry to observe the industrial scale fermentation and distillation processes. This is the largest distillery in South Each Asia, transforming wheat into a range of ethanol suitable for transport fuel (E10 and E85), beverages, pharmaceuticals, personal care products and industrial applications. It was an impressive sight.










Junior Boys and Girls Soccer 💝

A report by Alice McAlister of Year 11 on Model UN

Earlier this year on May 13th, Zahra and I had the amazing opportunity to participate in the Model United Nations Assembly. 
